

At this thanksgiving service today we mark the 75th Anniversary of Victory in Europe Day (Friday the 8th May) with the formal surrender of Germany. The war in the Far East would continue until August 1945 when Japan surrendered.

Over 125 local Brixham people had lost their lives, with many more suffering disablement and bereavement. Over 400,000 people had died nationwide and over 63 million worldwide.

Once VE was declared, the nation held services of thanksgiving throughout the day and evening. At this Sunday service we share the spirit of that rejoicing but also remembrance.

We give thanks for the valour and bravery of the sailors, soldiers, airmen, and civilians who gave their tomorrow for our today.

Today, we mark the 75th Anniversary by praying that the peace they won through victory over cruelty and oppression may be a blessing in our day for Europe and for the whole world.

The VE Day Speech Of His Majesty King George VI in 1945

read by Lord Lieutenant of Devon representing Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

Today we give thanks to almighty God for a great deliverance. Speaking from our Empire's oldest capital city, war-battered but never for one moment daunted or dismayed—speaking from London, I ask you to join with me in that act of thanksgiving.

There is great comfort in the thought that the years of darkness and danger in which the children of our country have grown up are over and, please God, for ever. We shall have failed and the blood of our dearest will have flowed in vain if the victory which they died to win does not lead to a lasting peace, founded on justice and good will.

This is the task to which now honour binds us. In the hour of danger, we humbly committed our cause into the hand of God and he has been our strength and shield. Let us thank him for his mercies and in this hour of victory commit ourselves and our new task to the guidance of that same strong hand.

All Saints Church

All Saints' Church will always be synonymous with Henry Francis Lyte the first Vicar and writer of his most famous "Abide with me". The inside of the present church has also seen considerable change.

In 1938 a set of painted panels on the wall above the altar-the reredos were designed and installed. They depict the incident from St. Luke's Gospel in which the words "Abide with me" were derived. The risen Jesus is recognised by two disciples after he has joined them on a walk. The musical angels stand for Rev. Lyte's hymns, and the sower and fisherman represent Higher and Lower Brixham, known as Cowtown and Fishtown, respectively.

In 1977, St Peter's Chapel became a separate area for worship after the closure of the fishermen's church of St Peter, at the top of St Peter's Hill. The Chapel is in regular use today for weekday services and as a place of quiet reflection.

There are memorials on the church walls to parishioners who lost their lives in the two World Wars. These include a member of the early Royal Air Force, and another for fishermen killed when they caught a mine in their nets.

The famous carillon and bells were installed in 1929, so that All Saints' bells now mark the hours in 15 minute intervals, and also ring out each evening
